PRACTICE

- 1 Cara gets 4 daily maths questions right every day in 4th class. After 10 school days, how many questions has she answered correctly in total?
- 2 9 schools take part in a Cumann na mBunscol blitz at the county grounds. Each school brings 28 pupils to play. How many pupils are at the blitz in total?

CHALLENGE

- 1 4th class have 115 paper bookmarks to hang around the classroom for World Book Day. They share them equally onto 5 long strings of bunting. How many bookmarks go on each string?
- 2 At Camogie training under the floodlights, the coach has 48 cones to set out in equal rows. List every factor of 48 in order from smallest to largest, so the coach can see all the row sizes she could choose.
