

Money – review of euro and cent

MODULE 5 · TIME AND MONEY NUMBER

Money in Ireland is the **euro (€)**. **100 cent = €1**. Coins: **1c, 2c, 5c, 10c, 20c, 50c, €1, €2**. Notes: **€5, €10, €20, €50, €100, €200, €500**.

→ **€2.45** = 2 euros and 45 cent.

→ **350 cent** = **€3.50** ($350 \div 100 = 3.5$).

→ **€0.05** = 5 cent.

HOW TO ANSWER TODAY

- **Round to nearest....** Look at the digit ONE place to the right of where you're rounding to. 5 or more → round up; less than 5 → keep.

7.34 to nearest tenth → 7.3 (the 4 is less than 5). · 7.36 → 7.4.

TRY IT ON THE LINE

Build each amount with coins (you can use as many of each as you like). Fill the count under each coin face.

Make each amount: **€2.45, €3.99, €0.55, €15.10**

€2	€1	50c	20c	10c	5c	2c	1c

1. Row 1: **€2.45** — try with fewest coins.
2. Row 2: **€3.99** — every coin matters!
3. Row 3: **€0.55** — only cent coins.
4. Row 4: **€15.10** — use some €2 coins to keep the count low.

PRACTICE

- 1 5th class are making sandwich platters for the school picnic. Each platter costs **€95.22** in ingredients, and the class is preparing **10** platters for all the year groups. How much will the ingredients cost in total?
- 2 The school tour to the Cliffs of Moher costs **€23.87** per pupil. **100** pupils from 5th and 6th class are going on the trip. What is the total cost for all the pupils?
