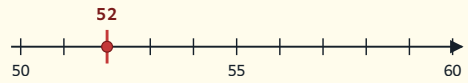


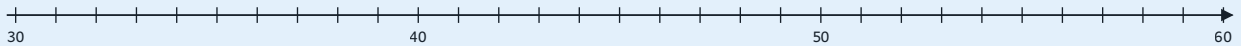
ROUNDING TO THE NEAREST 10

- 52 sits between 50 and 60.
- The units digit is 2, which is less than 5, so 52 is nearer 50.
- So 52 rounds down to 50.



WARM-UP

Mark each number on the number line, then circle the nearer ten it rounds to.



- Mark 38, 46 and 55 on the line between 30 and 60.
- For each one, name the two tens it sits between.
- Circle the ten each number is nearer to.

PRACTICE

- A bag of apples costs 38 cent. Round 38 to the nearest 10 cent.
- There are 74 buns on the bakery tray. Round 74 to the nearest 10.
- A shopper puts 46 oranges in a box. Round 46 to the nearest 10.
- A shelf holds 55 tins of beans. Round 55 to the nearest 10.
- The fruit stall sold 91 bananas today. Round 91 to the nearest 10.

SPOT THE MISTAKE

Sean rounds 65 to the nearest 10 like this:

65 is halfway between 60 and 70.
Halfway means round down.
So 65 rounds to 60.

Sean used the wrong halfway rule. What is the correct answer?
