

IS 40 A MULTIPLE OF 5 AND 10?

- The shaded cells show the count in fives: 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35, 40.
- Because **40** is shaded it is a multiple of **5**, and it ends in **0**.
- Counting in tens (10, 20, 30, **40**) also lands on 40, so it is a multiple of **10** too.
