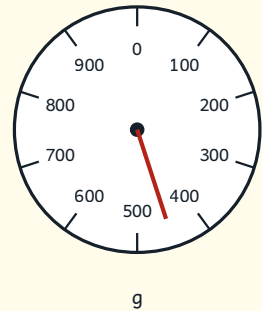


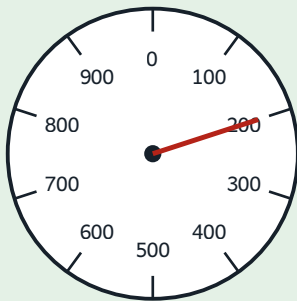
READING A WEIGHT IN GRAMS

- 1 The scale is marked in **100 g** steps from 0 to **1000 g**.
- 2 The needle sits halfway between **400** and **500**.
- 3 Halfway is **450 g**, so the weight is **450 g**.

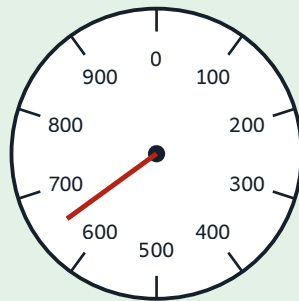


WARM-UP

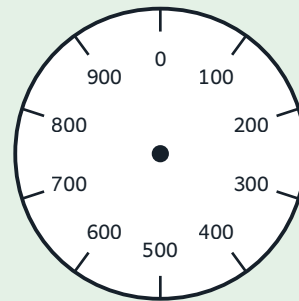
Read the needle on each weighing-scale dial and write the grams.
