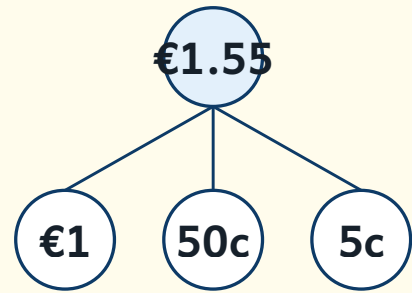


FEWEST COINS FOR €1.55

- 1 Read the amount: **€1.55** is 1 euro and 55 cent.
- 2 Start with the biggest coin that fits: one **€1** leaves 55c.
- 3 Next a **50c** coin leaves 5c, then one **5c** coin finishes it.

- 5 A box of eggs costs **€2.40**. Build it using the fewest pieces you can.
- 6 A wedge of cheese costs **€3.08**. List the fewest coins and notes that make it exactly.
