

READING ONE-SYMBOL-MEANS-ONE

- 1 The key says one tally mark = 1 pupil.
- 2 Count the marks in the Apple row one by one: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6.
- 3 There are 6 marks, so 6 pupils chose apple.

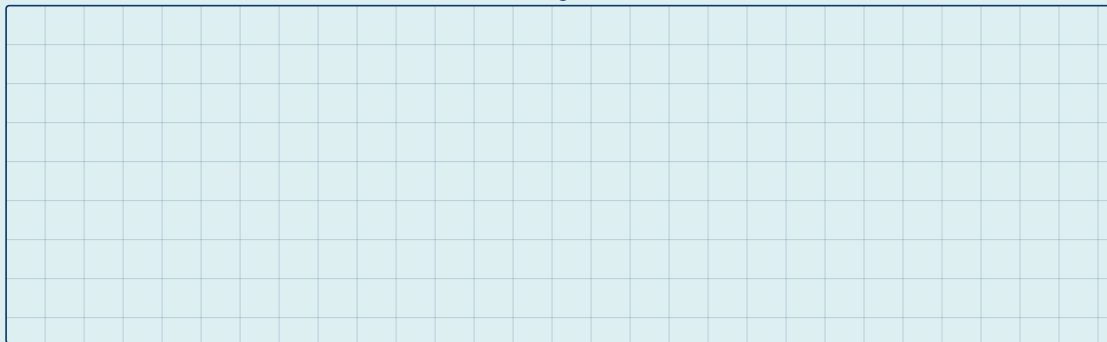

WARM-UP

Use the squared space to draw a small pictogram key and rows, one picture per pupil.

Pictogram



1. Draw a key at the top: one circle = 1 pupil, then draw a row of 7 circles for the apple lunch and a row of 4 circles for the banana lunch.
2. Draw a row of 10 circles for milk, a row of 6 circles for juice and a row of 5 circles for water, starting every row level at the same edge.
3. Count the milk, juice and water rows and write the total number of pupils ($10 + 6 + 5$) underneath.

PRACTICE

- 1 On the class reading pictogram, the 'reading' row has 5 book pictures. One book means 1 pupil, so how many pupils like reading best?
- 2 In the class art chart, the 'drawing' row shows 8 pencil pictures. One pencil means 1 pupil. How many pupils chose drawing?
- 3 The star chart on the wall shows 3 star pictures for pupils who got full marks. One star means 1 pupil. How many pupils got full marks?
- 4 The favourite-subject pictogram shows 9 ball pictures for PE and 6 for art. One ball means 1 pupil. How many more pupils chose PE than art?
- 5 On the lunch pictogram the apple row has 7 pictures and the banana row has 4 pictures. One picture means 1 pupil. How many pupils are shown altogether?
