

IS 42 A MULTIPLE OF 6?

- 1 The hundred square shows the multiples of 6 shaded: 6, 12, 18, 24, 30, 36, **42**.
- 2 We land exactly on **42**, so it is a multiple of 6.
- 3 Check the times fact: $6 \times 7 = 42$.
