

HOW TO PARTITION 256

- 1 Look at the number **256** carefully.
- 2 The hundreds digit is **2**, so its value is **200**.
- 3 The tens digit is **5**, so its value is **50**.
- 4 The units digit is **6**, so its value is **6**.
- 5 Write the partition as $256 = 200 + 50 + 6$ and add the parts to check.

 $140 = \underline{\quad} + \underline{\quad} + \underline{\quad}$
- 4 The teacher counted out **250** stickers for the reward chart. Partition **250** into its hundreds, tens and units.
 $250 = \underline{\quad} + \underline{\quad} + \underline{\quad}$
