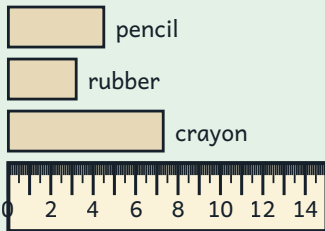


READING LENGTHS IN CM AND MM

- 1 Look at the last whole centimetre mark the object reaches.
- 2 Count the little millimetre marks after that to the end of the object.
- 3 Write the length as cm mm or as mm only.

- 2 The width of a staple on the teacher's desk is **3 cm** **2 mm**. How many millimetres is that?
- 3 A crayon on the table measures **7 cm** **3 mm**. How many millimetres is that?
- 4 The length of a key from the classroom cupboard is **2 cm** **8 mm**. How many millimetres is that?
- 5 A lolly stick on the floor measures **5 cm** **5 mm**. How many millimetres is that?
