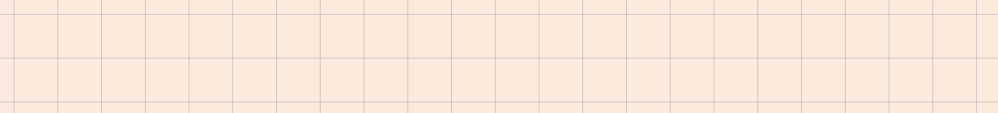


SORTING SHAPES BY NUMBER OF SIDES
