

READING 5,600 IN COLUMNS

- The columns are labelled Th, H, T and U.
- One digit sits in each column: **5** in Th, **6** in H, **0** in T, **0** in U.
- The **5** is worth five thousand and the **6** is worth six hundred; the zeros mean no tens and no units.

Th	H	T	U
5	6	0	0
