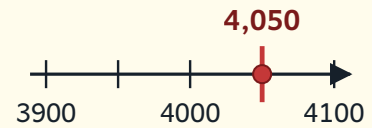


100 MORE THAN 3,950

- 1 Start at 3,950 and jump +100 (watch the hundreds digit).
- 2 The hundreds digit is 9; $9 + 1 = 10$, so it rolls over to 0.
- 3 The extra 1 passes into the thousands: 3 becomes 4.
- 4 Land on 4,050.



WARM-UP

Mark these GAA attendance numbers on the number line.



1. Mark 3,950 and then its +10 jump to 3,960 on the line.
2. Mark 4,000 and then its +100 jump to 4,100 on the line.
3. Mark 4,150 and then its -100 jump to 4,050 on the line.

- 1 A GAA club has 5,260 members. Ten more join for the new season. How many members now?
- 2 3,506 fans were in the stand, then 10 left early. How many fans are still watching the match?
- 3 A hurling stadium sold 2,970 tickets, then 100 more were printed and sold. How many tickets in total?
- 4 A county football final had 7,300 supporters last year and 1,000 more are expected this year. What is the new count?
- 5 The scoreboard reads 4,870 total points scored all season, and a big win adds 100 more. What does the scoreboard now show?

SPOT THE MISTAKE

Emma works out 100 more than 4,950 like this:

Change only the hundreds digit: $9 + 1 = 10$.
Write 4,1050.

Emma's answer is not a proper number. What is 100 more than 4,950?
