

WORKING 342 - 158

- ① Units: cannot take 8 from 2, so rename 1 ten. The tens become 3 and the units become 12. Then $12 - 8 = 4$.
- ② Tens: cannot take 5 from 3, so rename 1 hundred. The hundreds become 2 and the tens become 13. Then $13 - 5 = 8$.
- ③ Hundreds: $2 - 1 = 1$.
