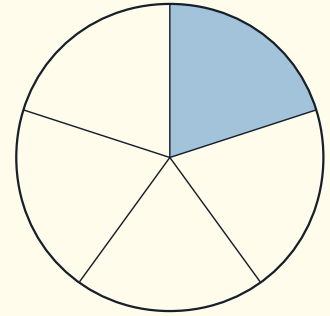


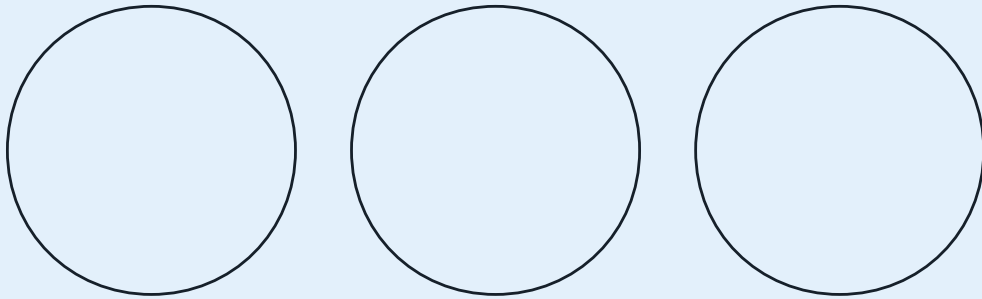
NAMING ONE FIFTH

- 1 The whole is cut into 5 equal parts.
- 2 1 of those parts is shaded.
- 3 The fraction is written $\frac{1}{5}$.



WARM-UP
