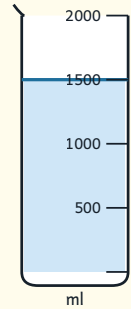


RENAME 1 L 500 ML INTO MILLILITRES

- 1 1 litre = **1,000** ml.
- 2 Keep the extra **500** ml.
- 3 Add: $1,000 + 500 = 1,500$ ml.
