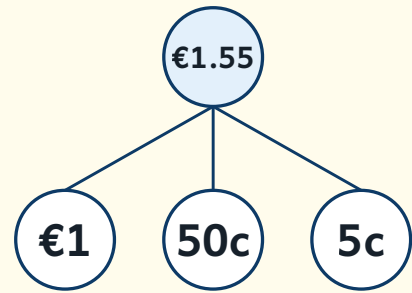


FEWEST COINS FOR €1.55

- 1 Read the amount: **€1.55** is 1 euro and 55 cent.
- 2 Start with the biggest coin that fits: one **€1** leaves 55c.
- 3 Next a **50c** coin leaves 5c, then one **5c** coin finishes it.



WARM-UP

On each empty coin tray, draw the coins and notes that make the total shown.

1. On the first tray make 65c using coins.
2. On the second tray make €1.35 in the fewest pieces.

- 2 Ben pays **€1.15** for a banana. Show the fewest coins and notes that make it.
