

SPENDING UNDER A €5 BUDGET

1 You have €5.00 to spend on a drink (€1.50), a snack (€1.20) and fruit (€0.85).

2 Add the three prices in the column: €1.50 + €1.20 + €0.85 = €3.55.

3 €3.55 is under budget, so the change is €5.00 – €3.55 = €1.45.
