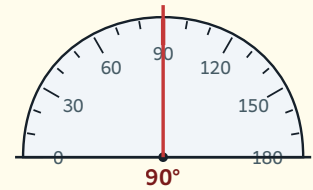


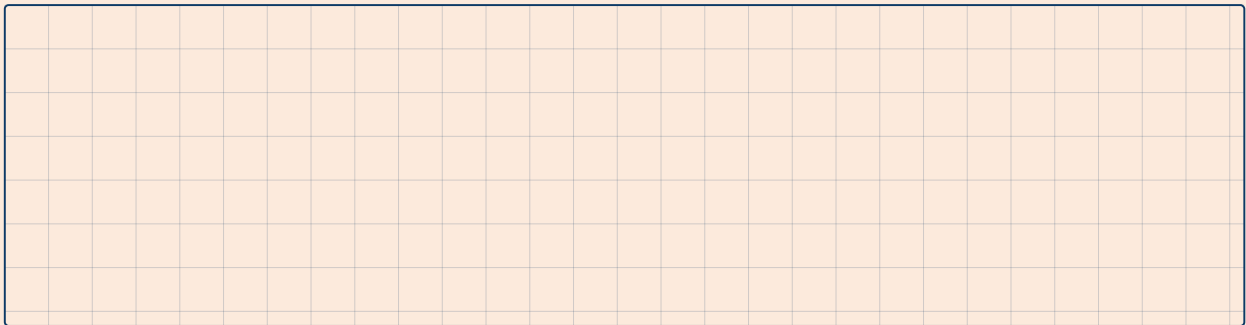
IS THIS A RIGHT ANGLE?

- 1 A right angle is a square corner — exactly a quarter turn of 90° .
- 2 The angle on the protractor opens exactly to the **90** mark.
- 3 Both arms line up with no gap, so this is a **right angle**.

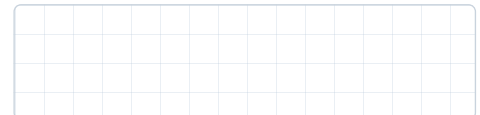
Use the corner of your copybook as a guide on the squared space below.
