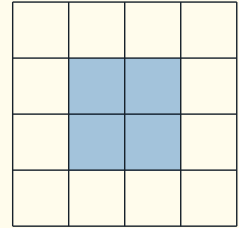


4 SQUARES TESSELLATE

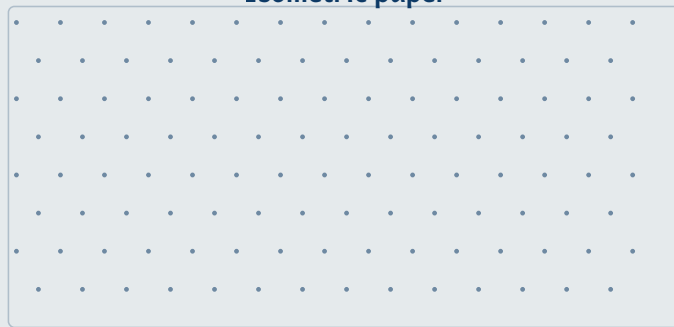
- 1 The grid shows 4 unit squares fitted edge to edge in a block.
- 2 Every shared side meets exactly, with no gap and no overlap.
- 3 The 4 corners meet in the middle and fill a full turn.
- 4 The block is one bigger square, so the squares tessellate.



WARM-UP

Use the isometric paper to draw and test these tessellations.

Isometric paper



1. Join dots to draw 6 equilateral triangles meeting at one point, with no gaps.
2. Join dots to draw 3 regular hexagons that share edges, with no gaps.
3. Write which of the two shapes tessellates, and how the dots helped you tell.

- 1 A builder lays 9 square floor tiles in a block. Draw them fitting together into one bigger square. Do they tessellate?

- a. Copies of a square fit together to cover a surface with no gaps and no overlaps.
- b. Copies of a circle laid side by side cover a surface with no gaps.
- c. Copies of a regular hexagon fit together with no gaps and no overlaps.
- d. A shape that tessellates covers a surface leaving little gaps between the copies.

IRISH FACT Bees that tile with hexagons

Honeybees build comb from **regular hexagons** that fit together with **no gaps and no overlaps**. Irish hives use this natural tessellation to store honey.
