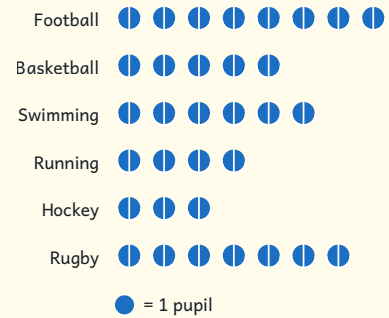


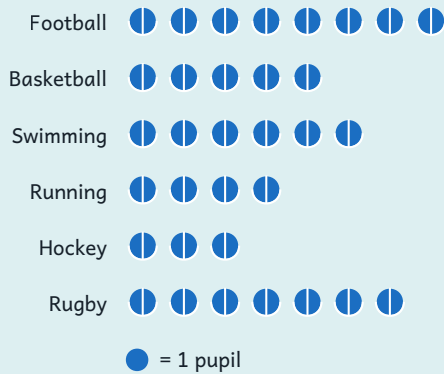
READING THE FAVOURITE-SPORTS PICTOGRAM

- 1 The key says one ball = 1 pupil.
- 2 Count the balls in the Football row one by one: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8.
- 3 There are 8 balls, so 8 pupils chose football.
