What you need: Investigation Journal page · cardboard boxes and card offcuts (clean cereal boxes, small delivery boxes; shared table tray for the pairs at that table) · paper tubes (kitchen or wrapping-paper tubes cut to short lengths; shared table tray for the pairs at that table) · paper and card scraps (shared table tray for the pairs at that table) · lolly sticks (shared table tray for the pairs at that table) · masking tape (shared table tray for the pairs at that table) · glue sticks (shared table tray for the pairs at that table) · round-tip scissors · name labels or sticky notes for finished models · project tray or shelf space to store models until the next part of this project
