What you need: group load-bearing prototypes from earlier in this project · real load for the job (library books, tablet, coats) or a tub of 1c coins and small weights · bucket and string for hanging loads · spare card and corrugated card offcuts (for triangular braces, gussets, wider feet) · lolly sticks · sticky tape · PVA glue (only for joins already fully dry from an earlier lesson — not for today's timed tweak) · split pins · scissors

Words to use

Load test · Measured improvement · Peer feedback

The problem
