What you need: kitchen timer or phone with alarm (moderate volume) · assorted wrapping materials (tea towel or cloth, bubble wrap, newspaper, cardboard, cotton wool or foam packing) · metre stick or tape measure · elastic bands or sticky tape to hold wraps

Sound · Muffling · Soundproofing
