



Inputs, processes and outputs

3rd Class

Print and cut along the dashed lines. These carry the **text a group reads** — a job to do, a brief to research, or notes to identify by. Check the lesson's teacher notes for how many sets each group needs and how they are used: some lessons hand out one card per group, others sort or sequence a full set.

Toaster

A kitchen toaster. Bread goes in the slots. You push the lever down. Heat browns the bread. Toast pops up

Torch

A hand torch. You press the switch. Electricity goes to the bulb inside. A beam of light comes out

Automatic door

A shop or school door that opens by itself. A person steps on the mat or walks in front of a sensor. The door motor runs. The door swings or slides open

Pencil sharpener

A classroom pencil sharpener. You put in a blunt pencil and turn the handle (or press it in). Blades shave the wood. A sharp point comes out, and shavings collect inside
