

A first look beyond 1,000 – the thousands

WHAT THIS LESSON TEACHES

Ten hundreds grouped together make one thousand, written 1,000. It opens a brand-new column to the left of the hundreds.

→ 1,300 is one thousand and three hundreds.

→ 2,400 has 2 in the thousands column and 4 in the hundreds column.

MODEL THIS ON THE BOARD

BUILDING 1,500 ON THE MAT

- ① Place **1** thousand-cube in the new thousands column.
- ② Place **5** hundred-flats in the hundreds column.
- ③ Say the number aloud: one thousand five hundred.
- ④ Check the columns hold 1 thousand and 5 hundreds to make 1,500.

a) 1 3 0 0

b) 2 4 0 0

c) 3 0 0 0

Q1: 1

Q2: 1 thousand + 3 hundreds

Q3: 1,600

Q4: 2

Q5: 20

a) **Always** — This is the exact trade that opens the thousands column.

b) **Always** — It is the brand-new place opened beyond the hundreds.

c) **Never** — 1,500 holds 1 in the thousands and 5 in the hundreds.

d) **Always** — Crossing 999 forces the new column to the left.
