

Time and money review

WHAT THIS LESSON TEACHES

Some everyday problems ask about time and money at once, so we sort out which part is a clock question and which part is a money question before we work.

- An apple 30c and a juice €1 come to €1.30 altogether.
- Paying €2 for a €1.40 roll gives 60c change.

MODEL THIS ON THE BOARD

APPLE, JUICE AND THE TOTAL

- 1 Sort out the money part: the prices are **30c** and **€1** (no clock part here).
- 2 Place **30c** on the coin tray first.
- 3 Add the **€1** coin beside it.
- 4 Say the total aloud and check: **30c** plus **€1** makes **€1.30**.

ANSWER KEY

a) €4.20

b) 60c

c) €3

Q1: 1 hour

a) Always — The lesson rule is to separate time and money so each gets the right tool.

b) Never — Price totals use the coin tray, never the clock face.

c) Always — Day-out plans like the bus example always mix the two skills.

d) Never — Change is found on the coin tray by counting coins, not by reading clock hands.
