

Pictograms – one symbol means one

WHAT THIS LESSON TEACHES

A pictogram shows data using pictures. When one symbol means one, each picture stands for exactly one pupil, so you count the pictures in a row to know how many chose it.

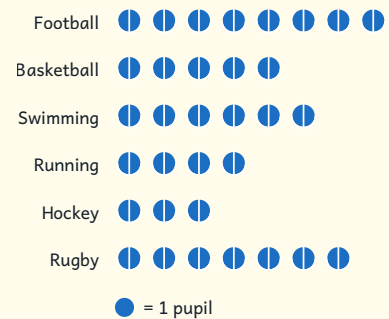
→ A row of 4 balls means 4 pupils chose that sport, because one ball = 1 pupil.

→ A row of 7 balls means 7 pupils, because you count one for each picture.

MODEL THIS ON THE BOARD

READING THE FAVOURITE-SPORTS PICTOGRAM

- 1 The key says one ball = 1 pupil.
- 2 Count the balls in the Football row one by one: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8.
- 3 There are 8 balls, so 8 pupils chose football.
