Je m'appelle	zhuh mah-PELL	My name is
Comment t'appelles-tu?	ko-MAHN tah-PELL too	What's your name? (informal)
Comment vous appelez-vous ?	ko-MAHN voo zah-play-VOO	What's your name? (formal)
D'où viens-tu ?	doo vyan too	Where are you from?
Je viens de...	zhuh vyan duh	I come from...
Et toi ?	ay twah	And you? (informal)
Et vous?	ay voo	And you? (formal)
