Welcome to ICT: Pick Something Real and Set Up Your Workspace

WHAT THIS LESSON DOES

Students learn that five Key Assignments live in one Project Portfolio, pick a vocationally anchored Something Real project, create their cloud folder and 01_project_brief, and complete a short brief with What, Why, Who, and three ICT goals.

WHAT STUDENTS SHOULD BE ABLE TO DO

- Explain that five Key Assignments live in one Project Portfolio as checkpoints your teacher verifies, not a final written exam
- Pick one real project from something you care about, and name who it is for and what you will make
- Create the Project_Portfolio folder in school cloud storage and open 01_project_brief from inside it
- Complete a Project Brief with What, Why, Who, and three ICT goals that each name a skill you want to get better at this year

BEFORE THE BELL

- Confirm school Microsoft or Google logins work on the classroom machines, know which stack the room uses, and have the password-reset route ready.
- Nothing to print for the cloud-setup step: the Common issues table is on the students' screens, and the set-up step points them to it.
- Print or project the Something Real starter menu, with paper copies for students without digital access.
- Prepare two named local fallback project frames for students who stall (a named placement type; a local club proposal).
- Be ready to project Jamie's four-heading template, and to approve or reshape project ideas so each has a real audience. Keep brief completion in the room, and fall back to the partial-complete path if sign-in ran long.
- Optional: a five-Key-Assignment wall chart or handout in plain English. Not ICT codes, and not a full 60-lesson map.

TEACHING MOVES

- Paraphrase the two intro key ideas orally; project one concept at a time.
- Walk Today / This year / End, then skim the 10-row milestone table once; point once at five KA evidence phrases on a handout if useful.
- At about minute 6 of project choice, assign freezers a ready frame so folder setup starts on time.
- Call out school-email sign-in and create-inside-folder before any cloud clicks; say which branch (OneDrive or Google Drive) to follow.
- Enforce the hands-up empty-folder wait before New document; prioritise folder + blank file for all if login is slow.
- Gate independent practice: show folder path before writing.
- Project Jamie's four-heading template and the weak vs strong ICT goal pairs briefly.
- Keep the brief in class. If short on time, accept What/Why/Who today and finish the third ICT goal next lesson inside the same file.
- Begin path ticks during the last minutes of independent practice; dismiss with the three-item exit checklist and watch sign-out on shared PCs.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Using a personal email for sign-in instead of the school account, direct students to use their full school email address.
- Saving the project brief outside the designated folder, require students to open the Project Portfolio folder first.
- Skipping the empty-folder wait and creating the doc in the wrong place, hold the class at the checkpoint.
- Signing out mid-lesson before the brief is written, sign-out is dismissal only.
- Leaving Document or Untitled files outside the folder, exit checklist catches this.

DIFFERENTIATION

- Support: sentence starters for Who and ICT goals; pair discussion for audience.
- Support: ready frames (named placement type; local club proposal) after five stuck minutes.
- Extension: First real action heading under the brief (offline step this week).
