SAY IT ALOUD

Je m'appelle	zhuh mah-PELL	My name is
Comment t'appelles-tu?	koh-MAHN tah-PELL too	What's your name? (informal)
Comment vous appelez-vous ?	koh-MAHN voo zah-play-VOO	What's your name? (formal)
Je suis	zhuh SWEE	I am
Et toi ?	ay TWAH	And you? (informal)
Et vous?	ay VOO	And you? (formal)
D'où viens-tu ?	doo vyan TOO	Where are you from?

THE CULTURE POINT

Je m'appelle — "I call myself", not "my name is"
