WATCH FOR

- Pupils dropping the little word in front (el, la). It is part of the word, not an extra — mark it as a spelling wherever the page shows it. Word search and Unscramble print the word on its own, so no article is expected there.
- Accents. One of this lesson's words carries an accent (la tía). A missing accent is a missing letter.
