Turn Numbers into a Chart, and Read One Honestly

WHAT THIS LESSON DOES

Calculate sums and averages with formulas then build an honest column chart starting at zero. Alter the axis to create a misleading twin and learn to spot unfair chart presentations online.

CURRICULUM OUTCOMES

WHAT STUDENTS SHOULD BE ABLE TO DO

- Calculate with a formula and build a chart that represents its figures honestly (LOs 2.4, 3.4)
- Recognise a chart that does not

BEFORE THE BELL

- Confirm student devices can open Excel (Microsoft 365) or Google Sheets with school sign-in working.
- The lesson builds its own honest and misleading charts from the five demo rows on screen, so you do not need external examples.
- Student devices with Excel (Microsoft 365) or Google Sheets; demo data ready on the board

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HOW THE LESSON RUNS

3 min	introduction	Start
5 min	content	Examine and discuss
16 min	activity	Hands-on: formulas, then an honest chart, then a misleading one
8 min	activity	Your turn
4 min	content	Make sense
2 min	content	Reflect
2 min	summary	What you covered

TEACHING MOVES

- Model SUM and AVERAGE once on the board so device time stays on the chart and the axis change.
- Project one path (Excel or Sheets) and call the other aloud only when needed.
- When the axis jumps from zero to about 35, pause and ask whether any number changed.
- Use student-created pairs to illustrate points in Make sense.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Starting the vertical axis above zero without noticing the effect; direct students to verify the axis begins at zero for honest charts.
- Omitting axis labels or titles; remind students to include all required elements before finalising.
- Selecting the wrong block for the chart; recovery: click inside A1:B6 and Insert Chart again.

DIFFERENTIATION

- Support: Offer a pre-populated spreadsheet with the demo data; allow plain-number total and average if formulas stall.
- Support: Allow paired work during Your turn so students can solve problems together.
- Extension: Challenge students to try the truncated-axis trick on a line chart, or build a fresh five-number set if time allows.
