1 • Write it five ways

- Wardrobe — Irish Vardrús • French l'armoire • German der Kleiderschrank • Spanish el armario
- Desk — Irish Deasc • French le bureau • German der Schreibtisch • Spanish el escritorio
- Bookshelf — Irish Seilf leabhar • French l'étagère • German das Bücherregal • Spanish la estantería

2 • Find what they share

- Open answer — Accept any two the child can justify, with the shared letters. Mark the reason, not the pair. No close pair: “none” is right.

3 • What you can do now

- Open answer — Ticks are the child's own judgement, not a test. The written fourth line is the one to read.
